

The whole architecture, in one letter

To anyone evaluating DebugInit,

It is reasonable to look at a company with several product names and assume it is several companies wearing one logo. This letter exists to say plainly that it is not, and to set out what is actually underneath.

DebugInit is a foundation. Nine layers: a core platform holding identity, permissions, workflow, audit, documents, search, notifications and APIs; an internal tools studio that turns an organisation's own operating model into software; twelve reusable business foundations; an AI-native layer where intelligence sits inside the workflow rather than beside it; an integration layer that is API-first and event-driven; an operations layer that makes the thing runnable; a trust layer covering authorisation, human approval and audit; MYNA, the intelligence architecture; and the work layer, wayworks.space.

The products are that foundation pointed at a domain. Learning, education, agriculture, healthcare, legal. Each one inherits the same permissions model, the same audit trail and the same intelligence, which is why a second deployment is not the first one all over again — and why each new domain costs less to serve than the last.

What that does not mean is that all of it exists today. Several of those products are concepts, one is exploration rather than a product, and the letters accompanying each of them say which. A roadmap written so that nothing is quite a lie is still not the truth.
